- decorating buildings with fancy lights.

How to stay fire safe during Diwali:

Have working <u>smoke alarms</u> and escape plan. If there is a fire <u>get out</u>, <u>stay out</u> and call 999, ask for the <u>firefighters</u>.

Keep <u>matches</u> and lighters out of young children's reach and never mess around with matches or lighters.

Take care with candles. Candles should be in proper <u>candle</u> holders and in a place where they will not fall over or anything fall onto them.
