EXECUTIVE SUMMARY	The Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Authority (Combination Scheme) Order 2015 sets out the entitlement of the original five constituent councils to places on the Authority.	
	A variation order was made in 2018 reducing the number of Members appointed to the Authority from 30 to 18 Members. From 1 April 2019 local government reorganisation in Dorset reduced the number of constituent councils to four.	
	This report provides confirmation of the 18 appointed Members and details of the committees, boards, groups and other bodies requiring appointments for the year 2022-23.	
	Prior to the Authority meeting, political groups have been asked to confirm nominations for these appointments. A full list will be provided at the meeting for approval.

1. Introduction

- 1.1 <u>The Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Authority (Combination Scheme) Order</u>
 <u>2015</u> sets out the entitlement of the constituent councils to places on the Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Authority (the Authority).
- 1.2 Membership of the Authority was varied (with effect from 6 June 2018) by the <u>Fire</u> and <u>Rescue Authority (Membership) Order 2017</u> (Statutory Instrument 1165), where membership was reduced to 18 Authority Members.
- 1.3 Local government reorganisation in Dorset (through the Bournemouth, Dorset and Poole (Structural Changes Order 2018) resulted in the abolition of Bournemouth Borough Council, Dorset County Council and the Borough of Poole and the creation of two new councils as constituent councils of the Authority:
 - Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole Council
 - Dorset Council
- 1.4 On 5 May 2022 Swindon Borough held elections for one third of the Council. During their Annual Meetings, the four constituent councils have made the following appointments to the Authority:

2. Representation on the Authority

- 2.1 The rules on political proportionality, under the provisions of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989, apply to committees of the Authority other than the Local Performance and Scrutiny Committees that are appointed to on a geographical basis. The political balance calculation for the Authority's two political groups is:
 - Conservative 69%
 - Liberal Democrat 31%

Total = 16 – there is in addition one Labour Member and one Independent Member, both of whom are ungrouped.

2.2 The Authority has established the committees and membership requirements, detailed in Table 1 below:

- 2.3 The only standing committee to which political proportionality applies is the Finance & Audit Committee and the entitlement to places are:
 - 5 Conservatives
 - 2 Liberal Democrats
 - 1 Ungrouped
- 2.4 The rules of political proportionality apply to both the Appeals and the Appointment & Disputes committees but as these are not standing committees Members will be appointed as required.

3. Political Group Leaders

3.1 Any changes to Group Leaders will be confirmed at the meeting.

4. The Authority Committee Memberships

4.1 As is protocol, the political groups have been asked to agree nominations of Members for the Finance & Audit Committee. These nominations will be provided for approval at the meeting.

5. Finance & Audit Committee Chair and Vice Chair

5.1 Following appointment of Members to the Finance & Audit Committee, the Authority will elect the Committee Chair and Vice-Chair during the meeting from amongst those Members appointed to the Committee. Only those appointed to the Committee are eligible to be elected to the Chair or Vice-Chair.

6. Appointments to Committees, Groups and Additional Bodies

- 6.1 Members are asked to consider and appoint Members to serve on the Committees, groups and additional bodies, as detailed in Table 2, for the year 2022-23. Where a continuing member of the Authority serves on any of these bodies, they are listed in the third column
- 6.2 Group Leaders have been asked to agree nominations with Members for confirmation and approval during the meeting.

7. Summary and key points

- 7.1 The Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Authority (Combination Scheme) Order 2015, as since varied, sets out the proportions in which the constituent councils are each entitled to appoint councillors to serve as Members of the Authority.
- 7.2 The Authority must then appoint Members to serve on its Committees, to a range of other positions and to outside bodies. Some, but not all, appointments are made in accordance with political proportionality.
- 7.3 Members are asked to confirm the appointments to the Committees, boards, groups and other bodies detailed within this paper.
