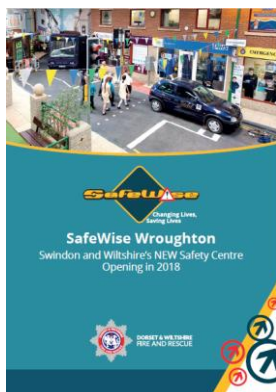

Planning & Procurement Update



A full planning application has been submitted to Swindon Borough Council outlining the specification for the Safety Centre and the use of the converted hangar.

Applications to tender for the safety centre construction work have now been issued and we are looking to have appointed our contractors by the end of April 2017. Subject to obtaining planning approval, we will commence the building work in July 2017 for completion early 2018 ready for opening later in the year.

Design



A draft design for the internal village has now been completed – this is an exciting stage and the 3D design brings to life the vision for the Wroughton Safety Centre.

A range of safety initiatives and scenarios have been incorporated into the Centre's design, maximising the use of the space we have. Debbie Lowe the Project Education Officer, is leading the initiative to develop the suite of educational packages, scripts and volunteer training programme for each safety scenario.
