# Safe Drive Stay Alive - Schools Expansion

## Expanding the programme to reach more young people

Below details the number of young people aged 16-19 currently attending and not attending Safe Drive. This is as accurate as we can be using the governments website <a href="https://www.compare-school-performance.service.gov.uk">https://www.compare-school-performance.service.gov.uk</a>

We are doing extremely well with access to schools. As an example, the STEPS pedestrian training programme run by local authorities for primary schools can only access 20% of schools. There is no other secondary road safety education programme that can gain any access to schools. Dorset Road Safe is in full support of SDSA because of its ability to gain access.

However, we should continue to drive this forward and increase numbers to achieve a minimum of 80%

We have identified 1183 students from 13 schools currently without access to Safe Drive Stay Alive.

#### **Barriers**

- Schools are under no obligation to engage with the Safe Drive programme. We are the most successful road safety intervention for this age group and reach far more people than any other organisation can. Many cannot gain any access to run road safety presentations in school.
- Capacity to deliver the education. Safe Drive is delivered by the willingness of all the partners and volunteers
  involved to make it happen. There is no road safety team delivering this education, we rely on the goodwill
  of people to deliver it and this must be balanced with the ever-growing number of shows.
