

## **Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service Children and Young People's Prize Draws**

### **Terms and Conditions**

1. Prize draw will be made following the closure of the competition date advertised on the prize draw form.
2. The prize is a VIP trip to a participating DWFRS fire station.
3. The parent/ carer is responsible to all transport to and from the fire station.
4. The fire station will be your nearest participating fire station, not all fire stations are suitable. The chosen fire station will be made in agreement with the winning entry's parent/carer.
5. Should the fire crew be mobilised to an incident, you will be given instructions by the fire crews (we will endeavour to provide a member of staff to stay with you but this may not be possible) If circumstances require you to leave you will be invited back at a convenient date to continue your visit.
6. Additional children maybe permitted to attend with the winning entry, the number of visitors will be in agreement with the fire station crew.
7. At least one responsible adult must always stay for the whole duration of the visit and they will be responsible for the behaviour of the children and ensuring they follow all instructions to keep them safe.
8. DWFRS reserve the right to cancel or postpone the visit.
9. The prize is non-transferable and there is no cash alternative.
10. Should this not be available in the foreseeable future due to closure of fire stations to public, DWFRS will provide a substitute prize.
11. Only one entry per child is permitted.
12. All entries are to be made on the Microsoft Form.
13. Personal data collected will be used to contact the winning entry and will not be shared with any other parties. After the winning entry has been contacted, all entries will be deleted.
14. After the winning entry has been contacted, all entries will be deleted.
15. DWFRS are not responsible for entries received after the close of competition date
16. The winning entry will be drawn using a random number generator with a witness
17. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence can be entered into.
18. These rules are governed by the laws of England and Wales.
