

## Apprenticeship Public Statement 1st April 2021-31st March 2022

We are required by the Government to publish our progress in achieving the measures set out in the Enterprise Act and below is a summary showing the number of employees and apprentices working for us as of 31 March 2021 and whether we have achieved the public sector apprenticeship target of 2.3% of the workforce being an apprentice.

Details of Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service progress on the apprentice target to 31 March 2022 are shown in the tables below.
