Source of Fire at Malmesbury Dealership

I refer to your recent Freedom of Information request received on 13 October 2023, requesting the following information:

Specifically, I would like to understand the precise source of the ignition with a view to understanding the possible involvement of lithium-ion batteries. To that end, could you please send any information that will help me answer this question:

the precise model of car in which the fire started

We are unable to advise what the make of the car was as we do not record this information.

whether it was an EV or a hybrid (including mild hybrid)

We are unable to advise you of this as we do not record this information.

a copy of any fire investigation report
